- Enjoy the little quizz. You will find the answers always on the next page.




1. Start the walk at the port in front of the Torre di Garibaldi.

- To the north of the old town, the Forte della Maddalena is the sole survivor of three forts built at the end of the 16th century. Its tower is known as the Torre della Maddalena or **Torre di Garibaldi**.
- Giuseppe Garibaldi was:
 - a) The King of Italy

- **Giuseppe Maria Garibaldi**, 4 July 1807 – 2 June 1882) was an Italian general, patriot, revolutionary and republican



Porta Salve

- On the right to the Torre di Garibaldi there is a big gate: Porta Salve, Porta a Mare.
- Go throught the gate. It will take you to the Piazza Civica.



Piazza Civica.

- What once were the most representative institutional offices of l'Alguer overlook this square; from the **Palazzo de Ferrera**, often the residence of the governors of the city and royalty on official occasions, to the **Casa de la Ciutat**, seat of the city council, to the **Palazzo della Dogana**, an obligatory stop for the commanders who moored in the harbor of Alghero.



- Take the lane on the right. Go past the colourful shop with a wide selection of typical Sardinian pottery.






2. Catedral de Santa Maria Immaculada

- The cathedral is one of the most famous sites of the city. It was inaugurated in 1593.
- The Catedral de Santa Maria Immaculada was built in:
 - a) Gothic style
 - b) Baroque style

- Go straight on towards the city walls overlooking the sea and magnificent Capo Caccia.
- The 2 cannons and a catapult prove that Alghero was a stronghold in the past and has seen lots of battles.
- Here you can watch one of the most beautiful sunsets in Europe.






Sunset at its best!


Go along this little street and at Jamaica pub turn right.

 - c) Ernest Hemingway




b/ Exupery's Little Prince
